It was reported that members of our Committee had met with Dr. Israel Wechsler who agreed to get together an advisory committee of psychiatrists to help us and meet with us from time to time. Dr. Wechsler believes that he could get Dr. Kubie, Dr. Guinsburg and Dr. Brill to serve on this committee.

INTERNE AT  
WESTPORT  
SANITARIUM

Mrs. Ziegler reported that she has had a conference with Dr. Gerow of the Westport Sanitarium who has agreed to accept a physician we recommend as interne at Westport. Mrs. Ziegler reported further that the Psychoanalytic Society through Dr. Kubie has agreed to contribute \$360 towards the cost of maintaining the interne at Westport; \$720 is to be given by the Capital Outlay Fund.

FUNDS FOR

Mrs. Ziegler is also to discuss with Miss Razovsky the possibility of obtaining funds to cover the salary of a psychiatrist, who it was recommended, be added to the staff at Mt. Sinai Hospital for the purpose of extending clinical services to emotionally disturbed refugees.

The Chairman again raised the question as to the soundness of our general policy in helping all refugees who are mentally sick to remain in the United States. Is it possible to ascertain what actually happens to mentally sick patients who are returned to Europe. It was agreed to ask Miss Razovsky and the NCG to get us a fuller and clearer statement as to the actual treatment of such patients abroad; also what facilities are available abroad for receiving mentally sick patients.

Mrs. Steiner presented the case of Arthur Runt, aged 55, who is in the United States on a visitor's visa. The tentative diagnosis is melancholia with a guarded prognosis. In view of the fact that the man is in the United States on a temporary visa, it was agreed that he should be cared for in a private agency rather than a public one.

My dear Miss Ziegler:

Following our conversation last week, I had a conference with Dr. Wechsler and also discussed the matter fully here with our Board in Westport, and I think we all see the problem in the samelight.

I am quite willing to cooperate with you in handling this work and in having a German speaking psychiatrist here in the Hospital, we furnishing the maintenance and you affording the financial re-imbursement. Details of this will have to be worked out, his trips to New York, etc.

Dr. Wechsler and I both feel that if it is at all possible a German speaking American trained psychiatrist is much to be preferred to a strictly German psychiatrist.

Will you contact me at your convenience that we may discuss in greater detail the problem?

I spoke to Miss Salzman of Bellevue Hospital about receiving mental cases that are violent and arranging for pay so that there should be no danger of deportation. She told me that there are so many W. P. A. workers on the staff that many times the records are complete before she even sees the patients. That is why she is a little worried.

However, I assured her that as long as we could notify her and get the bills paid, there would be no danger, particularly if care should be taken that the person would not become a public charge. She tells me that the charge in Bellevue has been reduced to \$3 a day, but urges that the money should be sent immediately so that there should be no danger of having the cases reported to the New York State Deportation Division.

She also urges that whenever possible we secure a private diagnosis rather than have the person sent to Bellevue. I promised that only violent cases would be referred to Bellevue, so far as we are able to control the matter.

The question raised was what would actually happen to applicants who are diagnosed as hopelessly sick with definitely poor prognoses if they were returned to Europe. It was agreed to put this question to Miss Razovsky and have the NCC give us answers since there are so many differences of opinion as to the treatment which such patients would receive upon their return to Europe.

Mrs. Ziegler announced further that Dr. Ackerman has set aside three hours a week to devote to such cases as we recommend.

Mrs. Stein presented the case of Arthur Runt who is at present at Hastings. The diagnosis is melancholia with a guarded prognosis. The man is 55 years of age.

SUBJECT Elly Sohn

This summary is in answer to your request for a brief resume of the presentation made to the Mental Hygiene Committee on the case of Elly Sohn, in November 1938. The case was presented at that time in order to receive some light on the following three questions....

1. Which agency should assume the financial responsibility in this situation -- the Cleveland or the New York agency?

The problem revolved around the fact that Elly Sohn was living in New York at the time of her breakdown and her family was living in Cleveland, Ohio.

2. Should the girl continue to be cared for in a private institution, since the charges were being met by a relief agency?

It was felt that perhaps it might be possible to place Elly in a city <sup>state</sup> institution and pay the lower fee there, if this would not create a possibility that she might therefore become liable for deportation.

3. If the girl were placed in a city institution, would the likelihood of her ultimate recuperation be the same as that in a private institution?

The situation which raised these three questions was in brief, as follows:

Elly Sohn, age 22, came to the United States in August 1936. She secured employment and worked regularly until May 1938, when she suffered a complete mental breakdown and was taken by her aunt, Mrs. Leo Sohn, to Bellevue Hospital. According to the recommendation of the hospital, the girl had to be institutionalized because the diagnosis of Schizophrenia had been made. Elly, as a consequence, was taken, with the advice and assistance of the organization, to Westport Sanatorium where a special rate of \$25.00 per week was arranged with Dr. Gerow.

Very little previous history concerning the girl was obtainable from her family and friends here. It was felt that she was quite worried over the responsibility of bringing to this country her stepmother and sister. So far as her relatives knew, however, she had appeared normal and happy at all times until her breakdown.

After being in the hospital for several months, Westport recommended that she be given Metrazol treatments. These began in the early part of November.

Elly's father, Mr. Gustave Sohn, arrived in the United States about a year after Elly came to this country. After remaining in New York for some time, he had gone to Cleveland, where he was residing at the time of Elly's collapse. By November, the girl's stepmother, sister and half brother had arrived and were all living with Mr. Gustave Sohn in Cleveland.

For the most part, the expenses of Elly's treatments were <sup>met</sup> made by this organization. The only contributions received from her family were as follows:

1. From her New York relatives, the cost of the Bellevue bill and the ambulance to Westport as well as about \$65.00 for her care during the first few weeks in the institution.
2. The promise of \$300.00 from Elly's relatives in Switzerland of which, by November, \$200.00 had been received.

The situation obviously raised the three questions presented at the head of this Summary.

*Some of the* RULES REGULATING LICENSED SANITARIUM INSPECTION *of N.Y. State*

General Order No. 27 on Licensed Sanitariums

- (1) Medical inspector or deputy medical inspector shall visit the licensed, private institutions at least four times a year and oftener if required by the commissioner.
  - (a) He shall examine medical certificates, histories and registries of admissions, transfer, discharges and deaths.
  - (b) He shall see all patients admitted and remaining since the last medical inspection, and preserve a list of their names since the last medical inspection.

General Order No. 41

Records to be kept in all licensed institutions.

- (1) History of case on admission, etc.
- (2) Copy of order of commitment must be sent to Department within ten days after admission of a committed or voluntary patient, whether insane, mental defective, epileptic, inebriate or drug addict.
- (3) Monthly report of movement of patients to be forwarded to the Department at the end of each month.
- (4) Annual report of movement of patients to be forwarded to the Departments soon after the close of the fiscal year as possible.
- (5) Monthly report of admissions.
