ABOUT THE INSTITUTE SPEAKERS

GRAENUM BERGER has been headworker of Bronx House and director of Camp Bronx House since 1938. He is a graduate of the University of Missouri and of the Graduate School of Jewish Social Work, and is a lecturer in group work at the New York School of Social Work, and at the College of the City of New York. A leader in the group work field, he is president of the National Association of Jewish Center Workers and the author of many articles on group work and related fields.

DR. WILLIAM H. DUNN, for fifteen years associated with the Payne Whitney Psychiatric Clinic of the New York Hospital, is at present chief of its Psychiatric Out Patient Department and assistant professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the Cornell Medical College. During the war he served in the Southwest Pacific, and later as Instructor at the School for Military Psychiatry. He spent fifteen months as consultant in neuro-psychiatry for the Fifth Service Command. In 1946, Dr. Dunn was assigned as a consultant in psychiatry at the Nuremberg Trials. He is a graduate of the Harvard Medical School, trained in Neurology at Bellevue Hospital, and also studied in Germany at the Berlin Psychoanalytic Institute.

YONATA FELDMAN is supervisor of the Bronx Office of the Jewish Child Guidance Institute, a constituent division of the Jewish Board of Guardians. She has been with the J.B.G. since 1928. Prior to that she was a case worker for five years with the Jewish Children's Bureau of Chicago, a child placing agency. Before coming to the United States, she taught elementary school in Russia. Mrs. Feldman holds an M.A. degree from the University of Chicago, Social Service and Administrative Department.

LAWRENCE K. FRANK is the director of the Caroline Zachry Institute of Human Development, and a trustee of the Public Education Association and of Sarah Lawrence College. He is an associate of the American Psychological Association, a fellow of the American Orthopsychiatric Association, the New York Academy of Science and the Society for Research in Child Development, and a member of the New York City Committee on Mental Hygiene. He is the author of many articles for professional journals, and a member of many committees in his field.

DR. SOL W. GINSBURG is a practicing psychiatrist in New York City. He teaches Psychiatry at the College of Physicians and Surgeons, Columbia Uni-

versity, is an associate in Psychiatry at the Long Island College of Medicine, and consulting psychiatrist for the Home for Aged and Infirm Hebrews. For two years he served as medical director of the Committee on Psychiatric Needs and Rehabilitation of the New York City Committee on Mental Hygiene. He is a member of the New York Academy of Medicine, the American Psychiatric and Orthopsychiatric Associations, the American Association for the Advancement of Science and many other related groups. Dr. Ginsburg was for sixteen years a member of the staff at Mount Sinai Hospital in the departments of Neurology and Psychiatry. He is a graduate of P. & S., and has studied in Germany and Holland. He is the author of many articles in his field.

DR. M. ROBERT GOMBERG, assistant executive director of the Jewish Family Service, is also an instructor in educational sociology, social case work and group work at New York University. He was for three years psychiatric case worker and psychologist at the New York Association for Jewish Children, and for two years guidance counselor at the Center School in New York City. He has also instructed at the College of the City of New York. He received his M.S.W. degree at the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work and his Ph.D. degree from New York University.

ARNOLD W. GREEN is a member of the Department of Sociology at the University of Pennsylvania. He was an instructor of sociology at the University of New Hampshire for two years, and spent three years in program research for the United States Department of Agriculture. He received his M.A. degree from Penn State. He has published several articles in the sociology and psychology journals, and currently is writing a book, tentatively entitled, *A Sociological Analysis of Personality Conflict*.

DR. ROY R. GRINKER, at present director of the Institute for Psychosomatic and Psychiatric Research and Training of the Michael Reese Hospital in Chicago, is also consultant in mental health to the United States Public Health Service, consultant in psychiatry to the Surgeon General of the United States Army, and consultant to the Veterans Administration. During the war, Dr. Grinker, who achieved the rank of colonel, was assigned as consulting psychiatrist to the Twelfth Air Force, R.A.F., and later to the U. S. Army Ground Forces during the Allied North African Expedition. He also served as flight surgeon at Randolph Field, Texas, and as

chief of Professional Services and Psychiatry at the Con Ce-Sar Convalescent Center in Florida. Dr. Grinker was graduated from the University of Chicago and had extensive post graduate training in Vienna, Zurich, London, and Hamburg. A graduate of the Rush Medical School, he has taught at Northwestern University Medical School and was head of the Department of Psychiatry and associate professor at the University of Chicago.

DR. M. RALPH KAUFMAN is chief psychiatrist of the Mount Sinai Hospital, one of the few hospitals in the United States where psychiatry is an integral part of the medical program. During the war he served as colonel in the United States Army. For the major part of his Army career, Dr. Kaufman was consultant neuropsychiatrist in charge of all army neuropsychiatric activities in the Pacific area. Before entering the Army he taught at the Harvard Medical School and was attending neuropsychiatrist at Beth Israel Hospital in Boston, in addition to conducting his private practice. Dr. Kaufman is a member of the American Psychiatric and Psychoanalytic Associations. He is a graduate of McGill University in Canada.

DR. HENRY B. MAKOVER is associate director of Montefiore Hospital. During the war he served as senior surgeon with the rank of lieutenant colonel in the United States Public Health Service Reserve Corps and was assigned to Washington as chief of the Health Services Branch of the Office of Labor. He is a member of the American Medical Association and the American Public Health Association. Dr. Makover is a graduate of the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. He is a frequent contributor to the medical journals and is an assistant in medicine (in absentia) at Johns Hopkins and Sinai Hospital in Baltimore.

DR. JACK MASUR, hospital consultant for the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies, has served as assistant director of Montefiore Hospital, and as executive director of Lebanon Hospital. He was senior surgeon of the United States Public Health Service assigned as chief medical officer of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Federal Security Agency in Washington. Dr. Masur is a member of the advisory committee to the Federal Hospital Council. He was chairman of the Convalescent Section of the New York City Welfare Council, and is a member of many national medical organizations. He is a lecturer in Hospital Administration at the School of Public Health, Columbia University. He received his M.D. degree at the Cornell University Medical School.

MARK A. McCLOSKEY is director of the Division of Community Education of the Board of Education of New York City, a position he has held for the past ten years. For sixteen years he served as associate head worker of the Hudson Guild, for three years as administrator of the New York City National Youth Administration, and for four years as Director of the Office of Community War Services of the Federal Security Agency. He is a graduate of Princeton and the New York School of Social Work.

DR. PETER B. NEUBAUER is psychiatrist at the Child Development Center in New York City. He has taught at the Community Service Society, and was assistant psychiatrist with the Jewish Board of Guardians. Dr. Neubauer studied in Vienna and served at the University Clinic in Berne, Switzerland. He was a resident psychiatrist and junior psychiatrist at Bellevue Hospital and a research fellow at New York University. He will conduct courses at the Smith College summer session this year.

DR. JAMES S. PLANT has served as director of the Essex County Juvenile Clinic in Newark since 1923. Prior to that he was assistant at the Judge Baker Foundation in Boston, assistant physician and pathologist at McClean Hospital in Waverly, Massachusetts, and resident physician at the American Hospital in Neuilly, France. He is chairman of the executive committee of the Board of Directors of the National Committee for Mental Hygiene and a fellow of the American Psychiatric Association and the American Psychological Association. A graduate of the medical school of the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Plant also studied at Cornell, Harvard and the Sorbonne, and holds an honorary degree from Hamilton College. He is the author of many articles on psychiatry and psychology.

DR. HOWARD A. RUSK, an associate editor of the *New York Times*, is well known for his articles on medicine in that paper. Nationally recognized for his work in the rehabilitation of the physically disabled, he is a professor at the New York University College of Medicine and chairman of its Department of Rehabilitation and Physical Medicine. While in military service, he was chief of the Army Air Forces Convalescent Services Division, with the rank of colonel. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal in 1945. Prior to military service, Dr. Rusk was engaged in the practice of internal medicine in St. Louis, where he was also an instructor in medicine at Washington University and associate chief of staff at St. Luke's Hospital.
